Achievement Teams and Short-Term Wins: The Key to Effective **Implementation**

What are Achievement Teams?

Achievement Teams are all about collective efficacy, with an emphasis on improving instruction and evaluating teacher impact. When the four-step protocol is embedded in school practice, teams will have a greater impact on teaching, learning, and leadership. Ultimately, a commitment to collaborate means achievement for all students.

Small, incremental implementation strategies will lead to more sustainable results.

It is possible to enhance the effectiveness of teacher teams by focusing on essential key points for collaboration.

Critical conversation prompts between pre and post assessments:



Teams identify assessment result strengths and gaps



Teams reflect on who was taught effectively and who still needs help



Teams identify the instructional strategies that were effective and the ones that need more work



Teams identify concepts and skills that were achieved and those concepts and skills that still need to be learned





Choose just ONE standard or learning target that will have a significant impact on student learning.



Create a short-cycle assessment based on the "unwrapped" standard and/or alignment with Webb's Depth of Knowledge (DOK).



Share/teach students the success criteria of the learning target or standard.



Administer the assessment after 2 or 3 (varied based on teacher judgement) days of instruction so you can determine the prerequisite skills students already have or do not have. This will be your pre-assessment.



Enter the results of the pre-assessment into your Achievement Teams Google spreadsheet.



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Analyze the assessment results with your team using the four focus questions on the spreadsheet and select high-impact instructional strategies.



For one week, teach the critical concepts and skills of that one standard based on students' learning needs.



After one week of instruction, hold a monitoring meeting to determine if the instructional strategies are having a positive effect.



After 10 instructional days, administer the post-assessment (aligned/mirrored with the pre-assessment) and enter the results into the Achievement Teams Google spreadsheet.



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Analyze the post-assessment results with your team using the Achievement Teams reflection template. Identify needs for intervention and/or acceleration.
